Matters listed below are hereby submitted with the following recommendations; to-wit:

1. Federal/State/Local Legislative Update:

Receiving and filing verbal report.

Staff presentation by Melissa Lesch, Department of Intergovernmental Relations (IGR) staff.

On motion by Cano, carried by unanimous consent, the matter was received and filed.

2. 2015 Legislative Policies – Seed Libraries ([15-00206](#)):

Approving an amendment to the Environmental and Resource Protection Policies section by adding the following language: ~~“Support legislation that allows for the continued operation of seed libraries operated by libraries, educational institutions and nonprofit agencies”~~ Support legislation that allows for interpersonal non-commercial seed sharing as well as the continued operation of seed libraries and exchanges operated by libraries, educational institutions and non-profit agencies.”

On motion by A. Johnson, carried on voice vote, the matter was approved, with the revised recommendation of staff.

3. Comprehensive Transportation Legislation ([15-00207](#)):

Approving a resolution supporting dedicated State funding for multi-modal transit and City streets.

On motion by Cano, carried on voice vote, the matter was postponed for one cycle.

4. 2015 Legislative Policies – Investigation of an Officer-Involved Death ([15-00208](#)):

Approving an amendment to the Public Safety Policies and Coordination Efforts section by adding the following language: “Ability of public safety agencies to engage another public safety agency to conduct an investigation of an officer involved death.”

On motion by Cano, carried on voice vote, the matter was approved.
