The 2013 City Budget Process Begins

Mayor R.T. Rybak has released his recommended 2013 budget for the City of Minneapolis. The Minneapolis City Council will now begin the process to consider this proposal. One Minneapolis One Read - an Evening with Garrison Keillor and Diane Wilson

This year marks the second year of One Minneapolis One Read, a citywide "read" where the entire community is encouraged to read the same book and join in a community conversation. One Read week - the beginning of months of conversations - will culminate in an evening with host Garrison Keillor and author Diane Wilson at 7 p.m., Monday, Sept. 24 at the Minneapolis Convention Center Auditorium. Keillor will interview author Diane Wilson about her book, her life and Dakota history, followed by an audience question-and-answer period. Music and dance performances will accompany the discussion, and a light dessert will be served at the conclusion of the event. Tickets are \$10; \$5 for seniors, students and limited income (for those tickets, select the \$10 option and choose "apply discount" before purchasing), and are available at www.ticketworks.com or 612-343-3390.

The book is "Spirit Car: Journey to a Dakota Past," a collection of vignettes Wilson created to honor the lives of her Dakota family. "Spirit Car" is available in paperback at local independent and chain bookstores, online booksellers and www.mhspress.org. It's also available through Hennepin County Library and as an e-book.
