

Background/Supporting Information:

This matter and subsequent claim arise out of a motor vehicle accident that occurred on February 17, 2012. Abdulaziz Moallin was traveling west on 7th Street South and entered the intersection at Lyndale Avenue South with a green light when she collided with a City of Minneapolis Public Works vehicle. This was a substantial collision that caused severe damage to Mr. Moallin's vehicle which was towed from the scene.

As a result of the crash, Abdulaziz Moallin sustained significant injuries and incurred in excess of \$29,013.00 in treatment expenses. Mr. Moallin was also off work and incurred \$4,992.25 in lost wages. He continues to suffer significant difficulties as a result of his injuries.

Following a mediation with his attorney, we have reached a tentative settlement of Mr. Moallin's personal injury claim against the City and Mr. Kwiecien in the amount of \$22,500.00. This proposed settlement has been discussed with the Public Works Department and they are in agreement with the terms. We believe that the settlement is in the best interests of the City and recommend approval by this Committee.
