Subject: Land Sale Public Hearing
Vacant Housing Recycling Program

Recommendation:

1. Approve the sale of 4551 Russell Ave. N. to David A. Furry for \$22,000.00, subject to the following conditions; 1) land sale closing must occur on or before 90 days from the date this Resolution is approved by the City, and 2) payment of holding costs of \$300.00 per month if the land sale closing does not occur on or before the closing deadline. The sale conditions may be waived or amended with approval of the Community Planning & Economic Development (CPED) Director.
2. If David A. Furry fails to close, approve the sale of 4551 Russell Ave. N. to Khosrow Rostamkhani for \$22,000.00, subject to the following conditions; a) land sale closing must occur on or before 30 days from date of City notification, and b) payment of holding costs of \$300.00 per month from the date of notification to the date of closing if the land sale closing does not occur on or before 30 days from the date of City notification. The sale conditions may be waived or amended with approval of the Community Planning & Economic Development (CPED) Director.

Previous Directives: On March 30, 2012, City Council authorized staff to begin marketing and selling properties acquired under the Land Bank strategy of the City's Neighborhood Stabilization Program (NSP 1, 2 and 3) using the City's normal disposition policies and procedures for development parcels. The City acquired 4551 Russell Ave. N. on February 6, 2013.

Financial Impact

OFFERING PROCEDURE:

Public Advertisement. The sales price of this property is a restricted appraisal performed by an independent fee appraiser which reflects the fair reuse value.

COMMENTS:

On February 6, 2013, the City acquired a single family home from the Twin Cities Community Land Bank under the Neighborhood Stabilization Program (NSP), Land Banking activity. Land sale proceeds will be returned to the NSP Program and the Vacant Housing Recycling Program to cover ongoing program costs. This property was publicly advertised on the City of Minneapolis website and through e-mail notification to a list of 200+ developers and homebuyers. Two informational meetings were held to inform potential developers and homebuyers about the City's disposition process and the information was posted on the City's website. An open house was held to allow potential purchasers to inspect the property and a two-week application period was provided after the open house. Four complete offers were received; the two strongest proposals are being recommended for approval. The City is selling this property in its as-is condition.

Authorizing sale of land Vacant Housing Recycling Program Disposition Parcel VH-576 at 4551 Russell Ave N, Minneapolis.

Whereas, the City of Minneapolis, hereinafter known as the City, has received an offer to purchase and develop disposition Parcel VH-576, in the Victory neighborhood, from David A. Furry, hereinafter known as the Redeveloper and another offer to purchase and develop Parcel VH-576, from Khosrow Rostamkhani hereinafter known as the Alternate Redeveloper, the Parcel VH-576 being the following described land situated in the City of Minneapolis, County of Hennepin, State of Minnesota to wit:

LEGAL DESCRIPTION

VH-576; 4551 Russell Avenue North
Lot 2, Block 16, Sidle Park

Whereas, the Redeveloper has offered to pay the sum of \$22,000, for Parcel VH-576; the offer included a development plan and commitment to improve by rehabilitating the existing structure. This offer is in accordance with the applicable Redevelopment Plan and/or Program; and

Whereas, the Alternate Redeveloper has offered to pay the sum of \$22,000 for Parcel VH-576; the offer included a development plan and commitment to improve by rehabilitating the existing structure. This offer is in accordance with the applicable Redevelopment Plan and/or Program; and

Whereas, both the Redeveloper and the Alternate Redeveloper have submitted to the City statements of financial responsibility and qualifications; and

Whereas, the City has had the re-use value reviewed by an appraisal expert, stating that the re-use value opinion is consistent with the accepted methods in aiding the City in determining a re-use value for the Parcel; and

Whereas, pursuant to due notice thereof published in *Finance and Commerce* on July 17, 2015, a public hearing on the proposed sale was duly held on July 28, 2015, at the regularly scheduled Community Development & Regulatory Services Committee meeting of the City Council, at the Minneapolis City Hall, 350 South 5th Street, Room 317, at 1:30 p.m., in the City of Minneapolis, County of Hennepin, State of Minnesota;

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved by The City Council of The City of Minneapolis:

That the re-use value for uses in accordance with the Vacant Housing Recycling Program plan, as amended, is hereby estimated to be the sum of \$22,000 for Parcel VH-576.

Be It Further Resolved that the acceptance of the offers and proposals are both hereby determined to be in accordance with the City's approved disposition policy and it is further determined that both the Redeveloper and the Alternate Redeveloper possess the qualifications and financial resources necessary to acquire and develop the parcel in accordance with the Redevelopment Plan and/or Program, but that the City prefers the Redeveloper's proposal over the Alternate Redeveloper's proposal.

Be It Further Resolved that the Redeveloper's proposal is hereby accepted, subject to the execution of a contract for the sale of land and further subject to the following conditions; 1) land sale closing must occur on or before 90 days from the date this Resolution is approved by the City and 2) payment of holding costs of \$300.00 per month if the land sale closing does not occur on or before the closing deadline.


Be It Further Resolved that if and only if Redeveloper fails to close on the land sale pursuant to the conditions described above, the Alternate Redeveloper's proposal is hereby accepted, subject to the execution of a contract for the sale of land and further subject to the following conditions; 1) land sale closing must occur on or before 30 days from the date of City notification to the Alternate Redeveloper and 2) payment of holding costs of \$300.00 per month from the date of notification if the land sale closing does not occur on or before 30 days from the date of City notification to the Alternate Redeveloper.

Be It Further Resolved that the sale conditions described above may be waived or amended with the approval of the CPED Director.

Be it Further Resolved that upon publication of this Resolution, the Finance Officer or other appropriate official of the City be and the same is hereby authorized to execute and deliver the contract to the Redeveloper or Alternate Redeveloper, as appropriate; provided, however, that this Resolution does not constitute such a contract and no such contract shall be created until executed by the Finance Officer or other appropriate official of the City.

Be It Further Resolved that the Finance Officer or other appropriate official of the City is hereby to execute and deliver a conveyance of the land to the Redeveloper or the Alternate Redeveloper, as appropriate; in accordance with the provisions of the executed contract and upon payment to the City for the purchase price thereof; provided, however, that this Resolution does not constitute such a conveyance and no such conveyance shall be created until executed and delivered by the Finance Officer or other appropriate City official of the City.
