# Background

- MPD conducted a Body Camera pilot using standard operating procedure guidelines.
- The Police Conduct Oversight Commission conducted three community engagement forums and collected community input based off these guidelines, research, reports and best practices.
- The PCOC provided MPD recommendations to help inform the development of the Body Camera Policy.
