Resolution of the Homegrown Minneapolis Food Council, *Approved March 9, 2016*

The Homegrown Minneapolis Food Council recommends that the City Council amend the food cart ordinance to:

1. allow food carts to operate in areas outside of downtown (to include West Broadway Ave and possibly other commercial corridors)
2. reduce the annual license fee
3. improve food access by encouraging food carts to sell healthy foods and beverages, especially in proximity to schools and park zones.
