Joint Powers Agreement and Memorandum of Understanding for Youth Curfew/Truancy Services

Description:

1. Authorizing execution of a Joint Powers Agreement (JPA) for Youth Curfew/Truancy Services and a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the JPA containing provisions providing for:
 - a. Continued existence of the Juvenile Supervision Center established through the prior JPA;
 - b. A term of Jan 1, 2017, through Dec. 31, 2026 with automatic 5-year renewals absent a new JPA or written notice of termination;
 - c. Apportionment of annual funding to be apportioned equally between the partners, with Hennepin County serving as fiscal agent; and
2. Authorizing execution of a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the JPA containing provisions providing for:
 - a. City provision of services to assist in the operations of the Juvenile Supervision Center; and
 - b. A term of Jan. 1, 2017 through Dec. 31, 2017 with automatic 1-year renewals absent a new MOU or written notice of termination.

September 13, 1996 Council authorization for the initial twenty-year Joint Powers Agreement.

Background/Analysis:

The Joint Powers Agreement (JPA) is a partnership between the City, Hennepin County, and Minneapolis Public Schools to provide Curfew/Truancy services through the Juvenile Supervision Center. The initial twenty year agreement is terminating at the end of 2016, and the partners are requesting to enter into a new agreement. Both the new JPA and the MOU that details additional partner contributions have been reviewed by the City Attorney's office, the County Attorney's office, and the Minneapolis Public Schools Office of the General Counsel.

Financial Review:

No additional appropriation required, amount included in current budget.

Future budget impact anticipated.

Future funding may be required if the current funding source, CDBG public services funds, is reduced or eliminated.
