## **Supporting Information**

Fox Valley Technical College in Appleton, WI has received funding from the U.S. Department of Justice and requests the independent consulting assistance from the Minneapolis Police Department to assist with the deliverance of outcome regarding the Indian Crime Awareness, Research and Evaluation "Project."

The project evaluation will create a network that will collect and track crime in tribal communities. Currently, crime data in tribal communities is not being tracked. This network will also facilitate the sharing of crime information between tribes and the state. There is an urban/tribal crime link that is overlooked and the sharing of information will help to make the community safer in the urban area and for rural/tribal communities. The partners in this effort are from the federal, state, local, and tribal levels. There are six tribes participating in Minnesota (Red Lake, Fond du Lac, Bois Forte, Mille Lacs, Lower Sioux, and Prairie Island) and four tribes in Wisconsin (Oneida, Menominee, Red Cliff, and Lac Courtes Oreilles) for a total of ten tribes in two states. This project, when completed, will serve as a model for the rest of the country and will be replicated elsewhere.

A sergeant and an officer are assigned to work on this project and the grant will reimburse 80% of their salary.
