

Neighborhood Priority Plan Process:

When neighborhood begins preparing NPP:

- Neighborhood should identify process it uses
- How is community involved in setting priorities?

When neighborhood has identified draft priorities:

- NCR will inform jurisdiction staff
- Obtain reaction and feedback
- NCR will discuss concerns with jurisdiction staff
- Provide that feedback to neighborhood

Neighborhood approval of priorities:

- Following 21 day notice to community as a whole
- Demonstrate broad community support as identified in NRP Policy on Changing Approved Action Plans

After final plan is written by neighborhood organization:

- Neighborhood submits final plan to NCR
- NCR informs City Council, Jurisdictions, Department Heads
- NCR Solicits final review and comments from City Departments

Approval Process:

- If priorities based on previous Phase II Plan:
 - NCR Director, NRP Policy Board, or City Council may approve
 - Following NRP Policy on Changing Approved Action Plans
- If new priorities:
 - Must be approved by NRP Policy Board and City Council.
